

Pupil Premium 2016-2017

Background

At Birchanger C of E Primary School, our aim is to ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all students and that appropriate provision is made for all. Pupil Premium funding is an additional amount of money to the main school funds that is given to pupils who are deemed to be disadvantaged. It is to be used to ensure that their progress and achievement are broadly in line with all pupils nationally.

Not all children receiving pupil premium funding will receive the same interventions or support in the same way or at the same time. Pupil Premium funding may also be used to target children to be able to achieve expected levels of progress or progress leading to a standard of greater depth.

In the school year 2016-2017 there were 110 pupils in the school. 10 pupils were eligible for pupil premium funding giving a total fund of £18,300 so they form approximately 9% of the school population. The allocation of the PPG is monitored by the governing body.

The range of interventions depended on the level of need but included the following:

- Teacher lead intervention groups.
- LSA cover to release teachers to carry out interventions
- Focused feedback time delivered by LSAs and the HTLA
- Inclusion manager time to oversee the provision and progress of children in receipt of the PPG.

Effectiveness

Below is a table showing the % of children who received PPG and who met the age related expectation for that year. Also the table shows an average of the progress made by the children (where 6 steps is expected progress).
