SATS preparation

Our focus this half term will be to look at the vocabulary associated forthcoming SATS tests. We will continue to use assessments to ensure the children become comfortable with the layout and organisation of the tests.

Writing

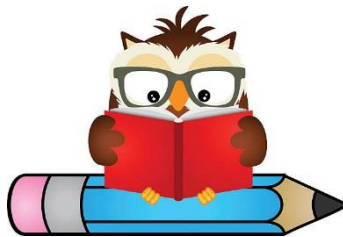
We will be looking at poetry linked to Alice in Wonderland. Also, the children will be writing their own murder mystery stories linked to our recent author visit as



well as writing newspaper reports.

Reading

The reading reward scheme will continue. Well done to the children last half term who received a Bronze, Silver or Gold certificate. Please note, that signatures for more than once per day will only be counted as one entry.



All children in Year 6 are expected to read at least **4 times per week! Please ensure that reading records are signed by parents/guardians.** Children who fail to read at home will be expected to make up the time during their lunch hour.

Maths

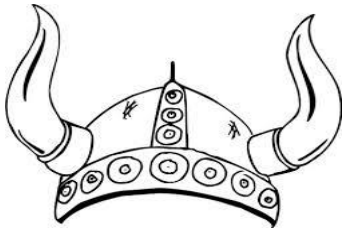
Over the course of this half term, the children will be covering the following areas in maths: algebra, ratio, converting units of measure (including length, mass, capacity and time) as well as calculating the area and perimeter of different shapes. We will continue to focus on multiplication tables and areas identified from assessments.



Science

As part of our Science week at school in March, the children will be planning and carrying out a range of experiments based on the topic of '**Energy**'.

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Topic

As part of our learning in History, the children will be learning about The Vikings. They will find out about the Viking raids and invasion as well as some of the key leaders.

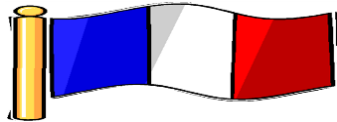
Religious Education

Physical Education

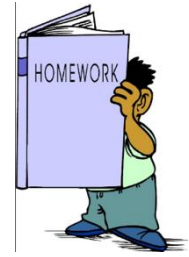
Tom will continue to take the children once per week; this half term he will be teaching invasion games.
